**FALLS TOWNSHIP  
RESPONSIBLE CONTRACTOR ORDINANCE  
COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 6 (c)**

This section of the Ordinance, as amended, states as follows:

**The construction manager, general contractor or other lead or prime contractor responsible for the project shall ensure that at least 70 percent of the craft labor workforce employed on the project workforce shall be comprised of either journeyperson, workers who have successfully completed an apprenticeship training program registered with and approved by the U.S. Department of Labor or a state apprenticeship agency or registered apprentices currently enrolled in such programs.**

In order to demonstrate compliance with the above, a bidder who is identified as the prospective awardee, and to whom a notice of intent to award is issued, shall provide the following:

1. The prospective awardee must submit written documentation specifically affirming that it will ensure that 70% of its craft workers cumulatively employed on the project will either be graduates of an approved apprenticeship program or currently enrolled in such a program.
2. In order to demonstrate compliance, the prospective awardee shall document the anticipated size of the workforce to be employed on the project, and the anticipated number of craft workers who will be graduated apprentices and/or currently enrolled apprentices. For example, if a particular crew will consist of XXX number of workers, XXX will be graduates and XXX will be apprentices. The information provided must be sufficient to allow the Township to confirm that the contractor will meet the requirements of the Ordinance during the course of the project, so that the 70% requirement is met for the project as a whole rather than on any given day.
3. The prospective awardee is also required to identify each craft or trade to be employed, and to identify the appropriate apprenticeship program in which it is enrolled so that the Township can confirm compliance for each category of workers.

The Sprinkler Industry Joint Apprentice Committee of Philadelphia, composed of members of the Sprinkler Industry and Sprinkler Fitters Local Union 692, has been a registered apprentice training program with Pennsylvania Apprenticeship and Training Council and the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training since August 6, 1951. Program # PA007510001, Trade Sprinkler Fitter, RAIS Code 0414.

In addition Sprinkler Fitters Local 692 has Graduated 77 Apprentices in the last 5 years, 15 in 2023, 9 in 2022, 24 in 2021, 6 in 2020, and 23 in 2019.

#### ARTICLE 4

TERRITORY: The territory embraced in this Agreement shall include the City Limits of Philadelphia and fifteen (15) miles beyond the City Limits of Philadelphia including the cities and towns of Trenton, New Jersey; Penns Grove, New Jersey; Phoenixville, Pennsylvania; Pine Run, Maple Shade, Jobstown, Arney Mounty in their entirety and excluding Penns Grove Airport, Carney's Point, Mill Lane Station, Aldham, Lederalh, Pleasant Valley, Horney's Corners, Edgemoor and Doylestown Airport.

#### ARTICLE 5

SCARCITY-OF-HELP: If, at any time, Sprinkler Fitters Local 692 is unable to furnish competent sprinkler fitters to properly prosecute and complete work within twenty-four hours, then the Employers shall be entitled to procure and employ Sprinkler Fitters, Pipe Fitters, Plumbers from other UA Local Unions and other Building Trades craftsmen in the order set forth herein. A journeyman sprinkler fitter may solicit his own employment with an employer who is part of the Collective Bargaining Agreement. Whenever there are Fifty (50) or more journeymen on the out-of-work list, for every journeyman who solicits an employer for employment and is employed by that employer, the next hired journeyman shall come from the out-of-work list. Any journeyman who obtains employment through the out-of-work list and is laid off within eighty (80) continuous hours of his hire date must be reported to the employer as a non-hire. The employer would not get credit for this hire and will need to satisfy this prior to being able to employ a journeyman directly. If the journeyman is absent for work during this time, those absent hours count towards his employment hours.

When an employee obtains employment through solicitation, the employer shall notify the Union in writing by fax or email within a Twenty-four (24) hour period. When Sprinkler Fitters are brought in from other localities to work within the jurisdiction of this Agreement, they shall be paid the same rate and work under the same conditions as set forth in this Agreement.

Lay-off shall be in reverse order, Building Trades Craftsmen, Plumbers, Pipe Fitters and Sprinkler Fitters from other Sprinkler Local Unions.

NON-DISCRIMINATION: The parties to this Agreement acknowledge that they are subject to State and Federal Law regarding equal opportunity and fair employment and therefore will jointly take the necessary steps to comply with these laws to assure, within the scope of this Agreement, compliance with equal opportunity and fair employment practice laws and that the employment, referral or selection of all employees shall be on the basis of qualifications without regard to race, color, age, sex, religion, sexual orientation, national origin and ancestry.

The employer may mandate standard attire to the extent that it constitutes a formalized uniform, if said attire is furnished by the employer. Employees shall not promote competitors or other contractors through their attire. The employer shall have the right to require employees to wear identification when required for security reasons.
